Field burning is prohibited

Aren't your actions causing a nuisance to the neighbors?

Open burning generates large amounts of black smoke and odors, causing significant inconvenience to nearby residents. Burning waste in drums, stacked blocks, or incinerators that do not meet proper standards is also considered the same as open burning.



Disposal and Separation of Garbage

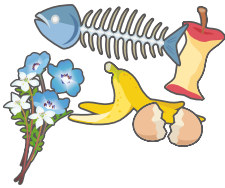

Burnable garbage

Put your garbage into the city-designated Satsumasendai City bags(transparent bags).Take garbage to the designated site by 8 a.m. on the collection day.

- Food scraps(No liquid)
- Drain used cooking oil into cloth or paper

Non-burnable garbage

Take it to the collection point in the city-designated bag (red) by 8 a.m. on the collection day.

- Please detach the electric cord etc. from the root and bundle it and put it in the same bag.
- Please remove dry cell batteries.
- Aerosol cans and gas cartridges are flammable hazardous materials.

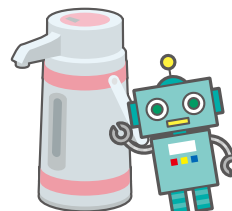

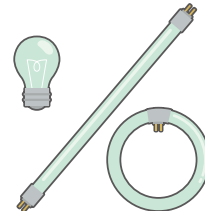

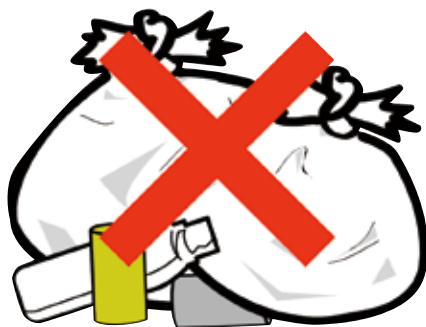

Caution



Certain items that cannot be left at the collection site.

- ① Oversized garbage.
- ② Supermarket bags and other shopping bags are not acceptable.
- ③ Improper garbage separation.
- ④ Putting garbage out on the wrong collection day.

Garbage collection locations installed in each area are governed by the residents' association for management.

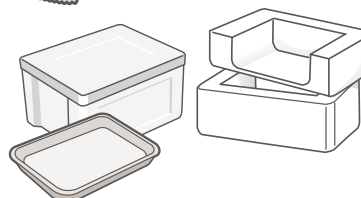

Items the city does not collect

● Oversized Garbage

(Items too large for 45L designated bags or with potential fire hazards)

【Garbage requiring special handling】

- ① You can bring garbage directly to the city processing facility.
- ② Call the Oversized Garbage Collection Center.

● The items unable to be processed at the city processing facility. ⇒ P4

Taking Items to the Garbage Processing Center (Sendai Clean Center, Kamikoshikishima General Waste Transfer Facility, Shimokoshiki General Waste Transfer Facility)

Items that can be disposed of

- General disposals (items not considered industrial waste) except the items that cannot be accepted at Clean Center (Refer to the page 4)
(You can bring household garbage and recyclable resources that can be collected at the collection sites.)

How to bring in

- Self-brought in by car
(If you cannot carry in, ask licensed general waste collection companies.)
- Please use transparent or translucent plastic bags.
(You do not have to use designated bags)
- Please tie them with string in bundles measuring within 1m in length by 10 cm in diameter.

Handling fees are to be paid

Fee: 300 yen / 100 kg

Electronic money is not accepted

※ 300 yen up to 100 kg, 300 yen per 100 kg for quantity over 100 kg

Items must be sorted properly.

Reception Hours

Please carry out the unloading of garbage at your own responsibility.

Licensed General Waste Collection Company

Those who cannot bring in the garbage on their own may request pickup from the general waste disposal service companies.
(fees charged)

Business related garbage

- Business owners are responsible for the disposal of business-generated waste.
 - Consult with licensed industrial waste companies which can take care of industrial waste.
 - The city does not collect business-generated waste.
- Please do not dispose of in the local household garbage collection site.**
- Please take care in processing the garbage either by taking it to the handling facility yourself, or by asking an authorized company to handle the collection.

[When bringing it to the Sendai Clean Center by yourself]

- It is necessary to obtain a carry-in permit in advance. After obtaining the carry-in permit, please act according to the permission conditions stated on the back of the permit.
- The second Sunday is not available.
- The loading fee will be 600 yen per 100 kg (weigh separately for burnable garbage and non-burnable garbage).



Don't put out the following items at Sendai Clean Center, Kamikoshikishima General Waste Transfer Facility, Shimokoshiki General Waste Transfer Facility.

The garbage that cannot take to the Processing Center, cannot be disposed of at the garbage collection site.

Potentially explosive, flammability, ignition, items

● Explosives

● Fuel (gasoline, kerosene, light oil etc.)

Consult with the manufacturer or store in charge.

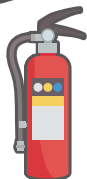

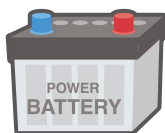

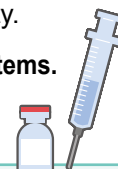
Infectious medical wastes

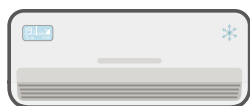

Disposal methods

- (1) Returning to home electronic appliance retailers. ※ Recycling charges + shipping fee
- (2) Direct drop-off at the designated reception place. Contact to Taguchi shokai (Togo-cho) TEL0 0996-42-0546 ※ Recycling charges must be paid.
- (3) If you will be transporting the item yourself to the Processing Center, pay the recycling charge at your nearest post office, attach the home appliance recycling ticket to the item.
Separate transportation fee is required. (3,150 yen/item)

Steel cans

Disposal methods

- Rinse with water to remove any dirt or contents from inside.
Please rinse items that have food on them.
- If the metal lid is separated from the can body, or if there is no recycling mark, dispose of it as “non-burnable waste.”
- Aerosol cans and gas cartridges should be disposed of as “flammable hazardous materials” only after their contents have been completely used up.

Disposal methods

- Rinse with water to remove any dirt or contents from inside.
Please rinse items that have food on them.
- If the metal lid is separated from the can body, or if there is no recycling mark, dispose of it as “non-burnable waste.”



Recyclable Garbage Disposal Guidelines (Bottles)

Returnable bottles

Issho-bin

(Only brown and green bottles)

(Sake bottles, soy sauce bottles, oil bottles etc.)

Beer bottles

(Beer, Shochu, Japanese sake, Wine etc.)

Others (Juice bottles, etc.)

Leave the lids attached to the Issho-bin.



Disposal methods

- Remove lids and wash inside before disposal.
Leave the lids attached to the Issho-bin.
- Leave the labels attached to the bottles.

Non-recyclable bottles

Bottle kinds

- ① Clear
- ② Brown bottles
- ③ Other colored bottles



Disposal methods

- Remove caps and rinse the inside.
- Take the inner cap of the bottle as much as possible.
- Rinse with water to remove any dirt or contents from inside.
- Leave the labels attached to the bottles.

How to separate garbage and recyclables (PET bottles, White food trays, Styrofoam)

PET (plastic) bottles

What is a PET bottle?

Items with the PET mark



Remove the handle as much as possible.

Disposal methods

- Rinse the bottles and remove the labels.
- Do not cut up or crush down the PET bottles.
- PET bottles that contained cooking oil should be disposed of as plastic containers and packaging.

White food trays · Styrofoam

What are white trays and styrofoam?

Those with color or patterns are to be put out into the plastic container.

Something that can be easily pierced with a toothpick



Disposal methods

- Rinse with water to remove any contents or dirt.
- Remove the labels.
- Please put only white items in the plastic recycling bag.





How to separate garbage and recyclables

Plastic containers and packaging

“Plastic containers and packaging” refers to containers and wrapping used for packaging merchandise.

Disposal methods

- Rinse or wipe off, then dry.
- Do not use plastic bags or double-bag your garbage.
- Remove as much non-plastic parts (such as paper or metal) before disposal as possible.
- Use up the entire contents of cooking oil in containers.

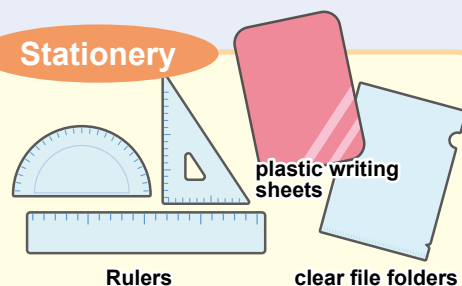
Plastic Items

- Made of 100% plastic with no metal or synthetic rubber components used.
- Measuring less than 30 cm on any side and not more than 5 mm in thickness.
- Not significantly soiled

How to Dispose of Plastics



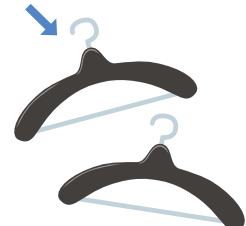
Plastic containers/packages and plastic items should be disposed of together in the plastic collection bags at the recycling collection station.

Items that are excluded

Note: Items over 30 cm can be disposed of if they are cut into smaller pieces. Items with metal parts can also be disposed of after the metal parts are removed.

How to separate garbage and recyclables (Cardboard and paper products)

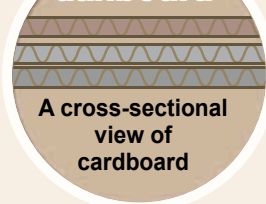
Cardboard boxes (danbouru)

cardboard



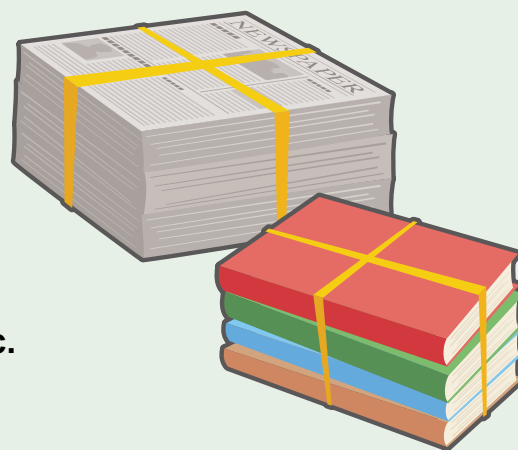
Disposal methods

- Remove any adhesive tape, fold and bundle with a paper string in a crisscross before disposal.
- Items with wax coating, aluminum cardboard should be disposed of as burnable garbage.

Newspaper, Flyers

Magazines

Weekly magazines, comic books, textbooks, specialized magazines, catalogs, dictionaries, paper bags, etc.



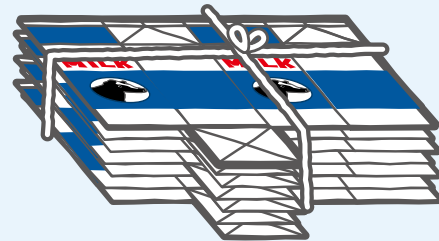
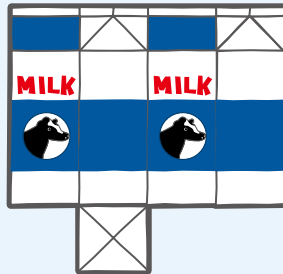
Disposal methods

- Fold into four and bundle with a paper string in a crisscross before disposal.
- Remove materials other than paper (such as leather, cloth, or vinyl covers) as much as possible. ➔ Burnable garbage.
- Please put out for local community group collection.
(neighborhood associations, children's associations and other such organizations)
- Iron-on transfer items included as manga or magazine freebies should be disposed of as burnable garbage.

How to separate garbage and recyclables (Paper beverage cartons)

Paper beverage cartons

Milk, Juice, etc. Cartons

Disposal methods

- Wash, dry, cut open, and bundle with paper string in a crisscross before disposal.
- Cartons with aluminum or vinyl linings (shochu, sake cartons) should be disposed of in the “burnable garbage.”
- Less than 500 ml cartons are disposed of in the “burnable garbage.”

Other Papers

Paper containers and Packaging.
Confectionery boxes, paper,
wrapping paper.



Disposal methods

- Flatten boxes before disposing, then cross tie into bundles using paper string.
- Remove the plastic handle and vinyl cover of the paper bag, put it out into the plastic container.
- Thermal papers, carbon papers, oiled papers, gold or silver colored items should be disposed of as burnable garbage.
- Iron-on transfer items should be disposed of as burnable garbage.



Flammable Hazardous Materials

such as lighters, including ignition lighters, gas canisters, and dry-cell batteries

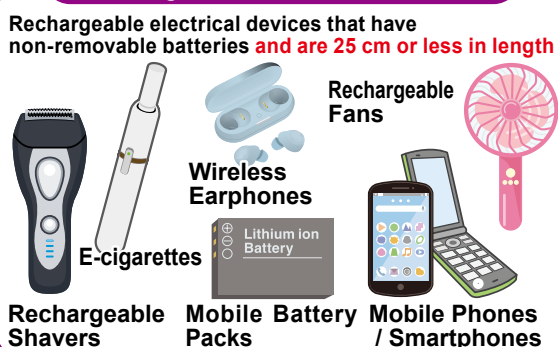
- To prevent fires and other accidents and promote more effective recycling, lithium rechargeable batteries and similar items will now be collected separately as “Flammable Hazardous Materials.”

Insulate the terminals or electrodes of all batteries and the metal terminals of rechargeable electrical devices with tape and place them in a transparent bag, and bring them to your community recycling collection station or a designated collection point.

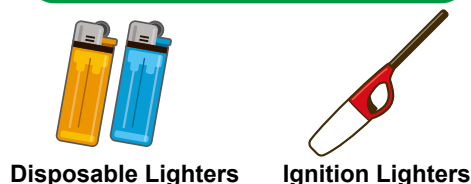

For swollen or deformed items, place them in a transparent bag and take them directly to the Sendai Clean Center, Kamikoshiki General Waste Transfer Station, or the Shimokoshiki General Waste Transfer Station, or contact the Environmental Affairs Division directly.

Drop-off Instructions

● At Community Recycling Collection Stations

Insulate batteries and rechargeable electrical devices with tape, place them in a transparent bag, and then put them into the orange collection container (previously used for collecting recyclable dry-cell batteries). Note: Swollen or deformed items cannot be accepted.

● At Collection Points

Insulate batteries and rechargeable electrical devices with tape, place them in a transparent bag, and then put them into the metal collection cans installed at each Collection Point. Note: Swollen or deformed items cannot be accepted.

Caution

- (1) Gas canisters and lighters must be completely emptied before disposal.
 Note: There is no need to puncture holes in gas canisters.

How to dispose of flammable hazardous materials

Category : Recyclables "Flammable Hazardous Materials"

〈Target items〉

1. Batteries



Examples: Alkaline/Manganese batteries, Lithium-ion batteries, Ni-Cd batteries, Ni-MH batteries, Button cells, Coin cells, Rechargeable batteries, and batteries for cordless vacuum cleaners or electric bicycles.

Note: Lead-acid batteries (e.g., car batteries) are NOT accepted.

2. Rechargeable Electrical Devices



Examples: Rechargeable shavers, Heated tobacco products, E-cigarettes, Mobile batteries, Rechargeable fans, Wireless earphones.

Note: Includes appliances where the battery cannot be removed, with a length of up to 25cm.

3. Gas Canisters

The cap is "plastic."



Examples: Cassette gas cylinders, Spray cans, Aerosol cans.

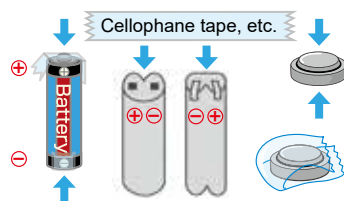
4. Lighters

Examples: Disposable lighters, Multi-purpose lighters.



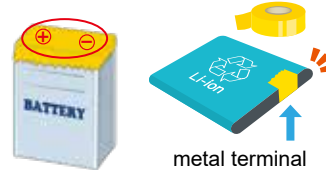
Points to note when bringing in goods

● Batteries



Insulate the exposed electrodes and terminals with cellophane tape or vinyl tape.

● Rechargeable Electrical Devices



Insulate the metal terminals with cellophane tape or vinyl tape.

● Gas Canisters ● Lighters



Use it up completely before taking it out. No need to puncture gas canisters. Remove the cap from the gas canister and put it in the "plastics" section.

Instructions for taking it out

Step1 Sort by type.

1. Batteries



2. Rechargeable Electrical Devices



3. Gas Canisters



4. Lighters



Step2 Place each type into a separate bag.

Perform insulation treatment

1. Batteries

2. Rechargeable Electrical Devices

3. Gas Canisters

4. Lighters

After insulating, the contents are separated into transparent or translucent bags.

Step3

They will be delivered on their respective delivery dates.

1. Batteries

2. Rechargeable Electrical Devices

3. Gas Canisters

4. Lighters



How to remove the lids from cans (aluminum cans and steel cans)

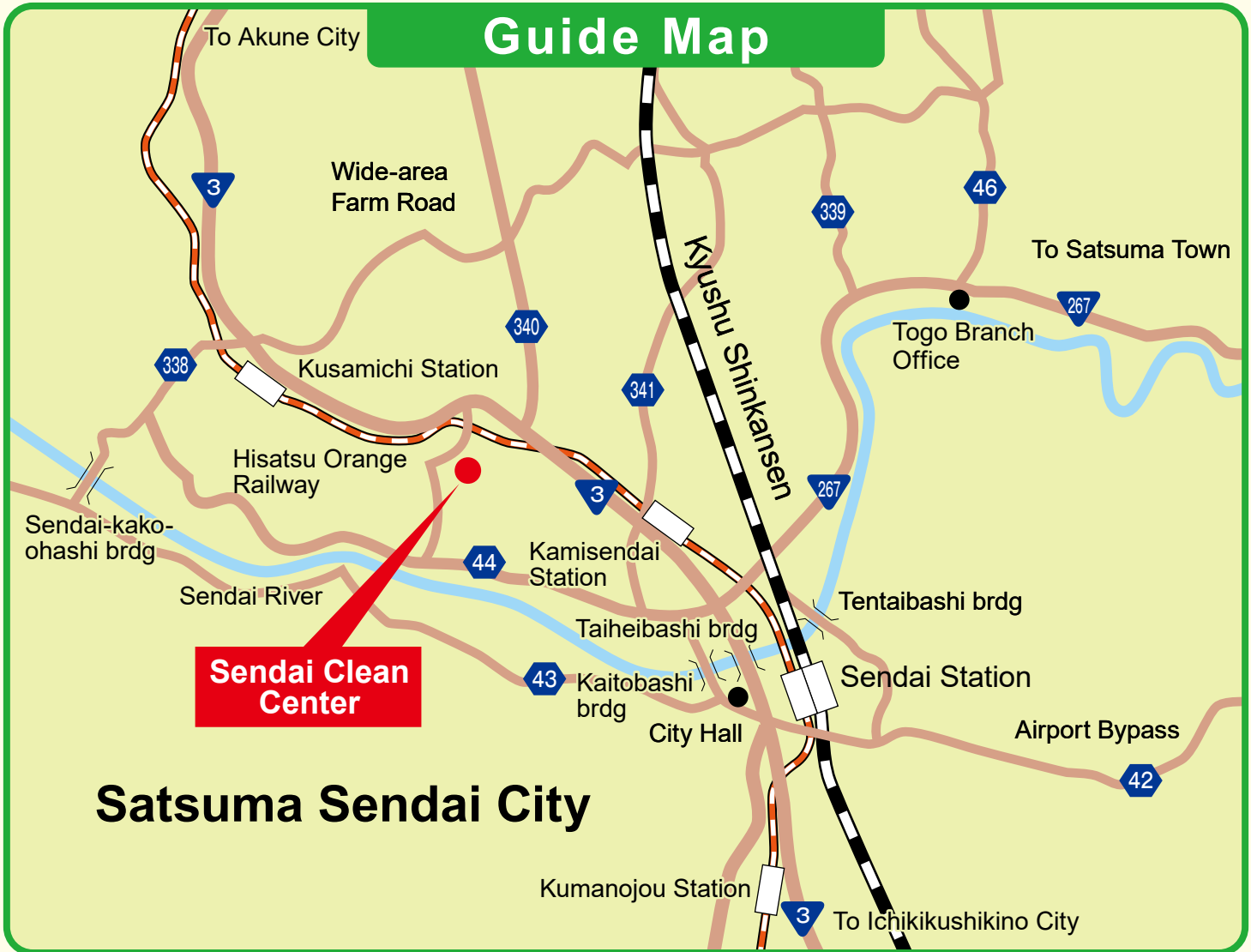
If the lid has a recycling mark (identification mark), put it in the designated can recycling bin. If there is no label and the can is separated from the container, please dispose of it as "non-burnable waste".



Expanded or deformed items, as well as rechargeable electrical appliances exceeding 25 cm in length, should be brought directly to the Sendai Clean Center, Kamikoshikishima General Waste Transfer Facility, or Shimokoshiki General Waste Transfer Facility.
